

1. Responsibilities of Bridleways Association Area Representatives

1. Check existing bridleways
Obtain map of rights of way and ride the bridleways in the area.
Maps of bridleways are available from the Secretary.
2. Report problems on line to Somerset County Council or Exmoor National Park
Training in such reporting will be arranged by the committee; information is available on the website.
3. Contact members in your area and encourage them to report problems direct
Ask them to copy you in so you are aware of local issues.
4. Post on website dates of cycle rides, 4 x4 rallies etc. in your area
The secretary will send e-mail warnings to the whole membership.
5. Increase membership
Put up posters in the area advertising the Association and explaining about on line reporting.
Posters can be downloaded from the website.
6. Contact Parish Path Liaison Officers in the area about rights of way issues
Lists of parish path liaison officers are available on the website.
7. Liaise with other organisations in your area using rights of way, e.g. Ramblers Association
8. Learn about rights of way, safety etc, attending courses if you can
Courses will be advertised on the website.
9. Propose new bridleway routes to the committee
These are particularly useful in connecting existing bridleways and avoiding busy roads.
10. Report to the committee on successes and problems in your area a month before the AGM
The AGM is held in October each year.
11. Report any problems you cannot deal with to a member of the committee
Committee members and their email addresses are on the website.
